

Things to know about Health Check:

- Online health assessment—administered by Virgin Pulse®
- Great way to receive personalized information about Virgin Pulse health coaching, Journeys®
 and other HealthFlex well-being programs that can help you achieve your goals
- Quick—15 minutes or less—even faster if you took the Blueprint for Wellness® screening this year as results upload automatically into your Health Check
- Cost-saving—avoid paying extra on your 2025 HealthFlex deductible (\$250 extra for individual deductible or \$500 extra for family deductible*)
 Primary participant and covered spouse must both take the Health Check by August 31 to avoid higher deductible
- **Confidential**—your church, conference, employer and Wespath cannot see your Health Check information or other health details

- 1. Visit www.virginpulse.com/login and click the Health tab.
- 2. Complete the **Health Check** by answering the questions throughout.
- 3. Once complete, check your score and see how risks and your lifestyle may impact your health. Results will drive personalized recommendations to Virgin Pulse health coaching, Journeys and other HealthFlex well-being programs to help you achieve your well-being goals. You will earn 35 Wellness Credits for completing the Health Check and additional Wellness Credits toward \$150** by working with a Virgin Pulse health coach.
