Caring for Retirees—Not Just a Domestic Concern

While some retired clergy in the United States may stretch their budgets to pay for vacations and entertainment, many retired clergy in the central conferences (conferences outside of the United States) often struggle to pay for their next meals. Historically, most of the central conferences provided little or no pension support for pastors or their families. However, the tides are turning. United Methodist clergy across the globe are now being served by pension programs. Program assistance and education through the Central Conference Pension program is helping these pension plans progress toward becoming self-sustaining.

CCP was launched via a task force established by General Conference 2000 to initiate a "pension support plan for the central conferences." At General Conference 2004, *The Book of Discipline* was amended to authorize an effort to raise funds. The entire UMC worked together to reach the funding goal and in 2007, the first pension payments were made.

Since then, the CCP initiative has grown to a full-fledged program that assists in the administration of retirement funds for clergy in 69 annual conferences. Retirement funds are now reaching nearly 3,000 pensioners amid some challenges that include serving those who can only be reached on foot by walking six or seven hours.

As evidence of progress, North Katanga and the South Congo, for example, now have full-time pension officers.

CCP assists in the administration of retirement funds for clergy in 69 of the 78 annual conferences in the Central Conferences.



In 2018, Wespath staff and CCP representatives visited 10 programs/pension offices to provide support and training and confirm payments are being received.

In 2018, CCP representatives visited Cote D'Ivoire, Sierra Leone, Philippines, Kenya, Uganda, Burundi and East and West Angola, as well as four episcopal areas in the DRC (Congo).

On each trip, CCP representatives met with both those who administer the pensions in the Central Conferences, and those receiving support.

In Cote D'Ivoire, Wespath COO Bill Kavanaugh and CCP representative Paul Dirdak met with the Bishop's representative, Isaac Bodje, and other conference staff. They also attended a "Widows and Orphans" celebration sponsored by the conference.

They then traveled to Sierra Leone, where they met with the Board of Pensions, Bishop Yambasu and pension recipients and attended a weekly worship service.

Moss visited two retirees separately at their homes in Luanda, West Angola.

Rev. Bento Francisco Pedro served as a pastor of The United Methodist Church from 1983 to 2002. He expressed his gratitude for CCP, stating it gives him hope for the future of the Church.

In a visit to the Congo, Paul Dirdak met with cabinets, conference leaders, the Congo Central Conference Board of Pensions of the area, and several retired clergy and spouses.
