Program Partnerships to Strengthen Clergy Well-Being

This fall, the Clergy Financial Well-Being Initiative is excited to partner with several United Methodist organizations focusing on clergy well-being. In October, the Initiative will provide a matching grant for <u>The National Plan for Hispanic/Latino Ministry</u> at a leadership summit in Phoenix, AZ and offer workshops on clergy wellbeing. The Initiative has also provided a matching grant for <u>Strengthening the Black Church for the 21st Century (SBC21)</u> to offer clergy wellness retreats. The Initiative will provide a matching grant and workshops on clergy benefits in Mid-October for the <u>Asian</u> <u>American Pacific Islander Clergywomen Association's</u> meeting in the Chicago area. On December 4, the Initiative will partner with <u>Gammon Theological Seminary</u> to hold a clergy training event in Atlanta as part of the Gammon Founder's Day celebration.



Annual Conferences Focus on Well-Being for Underserved Clergy

The Initiative continues to develop annual conference partnerships. Upcoming Initiative-supported well-being events for underserved clergy are taking place in the East Ohio, West Ohio and Indiana conferences. Recent past events supported by the Initiative include an Illinois Great Rivers well-being retreat for Clergy of Color in cross racial/cross cultural appointments; a retreat that included an EY presentation during a Clergy of Color gathering in the Mountain Sky conference, and funding for debt relief through the Iowa Foundation for participants in a Saving Grace class.
